Suggested Steps:

The faculty should help student to select the topic mentioned in the list of 20 projects topics and should give an option to a student to choose a project as per his/ her interest.

The project must be done individually.

The faculty should play the role of a facilitator and should closely supervise the process of project completion, and should guide the students by providing necessary input, resources etc. to enrich the subject content.

The Project work needs to enhance cognitive, affective, and psychomotor domains in the students. It will include self-assessment and peer assessment, and progress of the student in project-based and inquiry-based learning. Art integrated Activities, experiments, models, quizzes, role plays, group work, portfolios, etc., along with faculty assessment. (NEP-2020) The Project work can culminate in the form of Power Point presentation photo, video albums/files or shows debate/panel discussion, paper presentation related to psychological aspects, and whichever is suitable to visually impaired candidates. But the final project submission should be of written copy.

Students can use primary sources available in a village, towns and city where they are residing, Primary sources can also include newspaper cuttings, photographs, film footage and recorded written/speeches. Secondary sources may also be used after proper authentication.


